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SHEEP & CATTLE NUTS

Grain- based with digestible fibre, large (8mm) feed pellets, incorporating protein, energy and digestible fibre for convenient, low-starch supplemental feeding of adult sheep and cattle to support and maintain condition in situations when fodder intake is limited and supplemental protein, energy and minerals are required. These pellets are particularly useful in situations of "grain-assist" feeding during periods of higher nutritional demand from ewes and cows, such as pregnancy and lactation.

FEATURES: Convenient, palatable pellets. Easy to transport and store, and ideal for controlled quantity trailing on the ground or in troughs, for controlled maintenance feeding of ruminant livestock. Density of these pellets is typically around 650kg/m3.

INGREDIENTS: Cereal grains and cereal grain by-products, Almond hull meal, Lucerne Meal, Canola Meal, Limestone, Buffers (Acid Buf and Bentonite), Magnesium Oxide, Salt, Molasses, Trace mineral sand Vitamins.



HOW TO FEED: These pellets can be fed at up to 2% of bodyweight per day. These pellets will be very palatable to stock and it is important to avoid individual animals gorging on pellets when trailed on the ground or in troughs. Controlled and gradual feeding of pellets is important to introduce animals to a change in their diet.

To avoid problems with acidosis (grain poisoning) it is recommended that, as with any grain-based feed, an initial diet adaptation period be followed. Give special attention to controlling the introduction to excessively hungry or drought-affected animals by ensuring they are fed some fibre forage before introducing a small amount of pellets. Over the first 10 days, feed small controlled amounts of pellets each day, starting with 0.2% of bodyweight per day, and gradually increase the daily amount fed in 0.2% steps to the desired maintenance level. After this period of introduction, these feed pellets should continue to be fed at the daily rate per head as a supplement in conjunction with natural or conserved forage fibre. Ensure that access to clean fresh water is always available.
